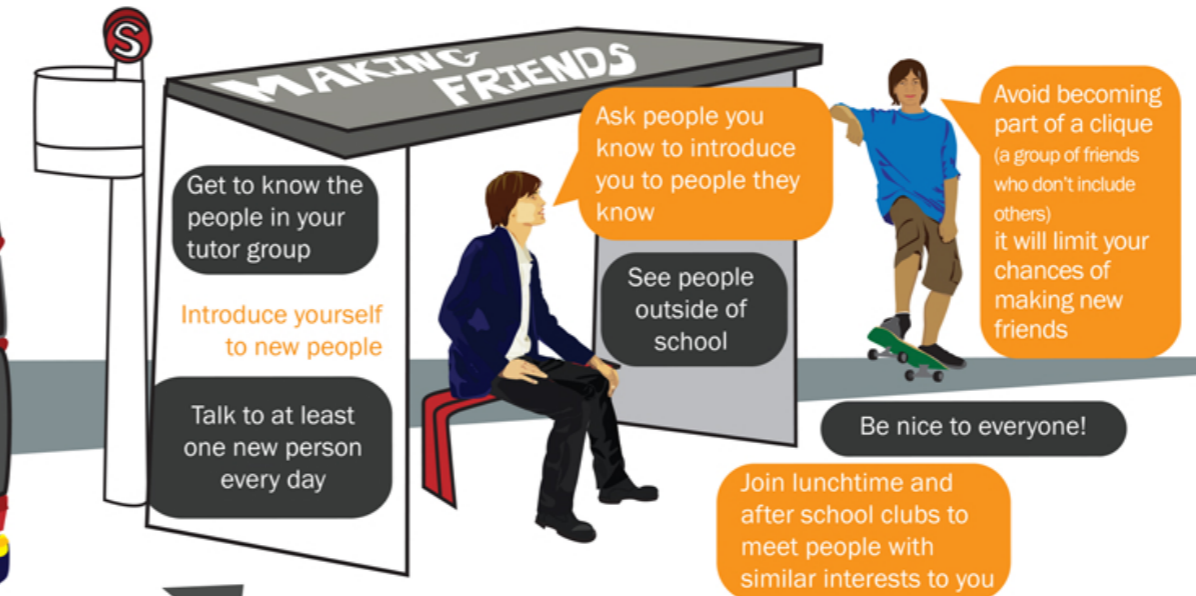

HOME WORK

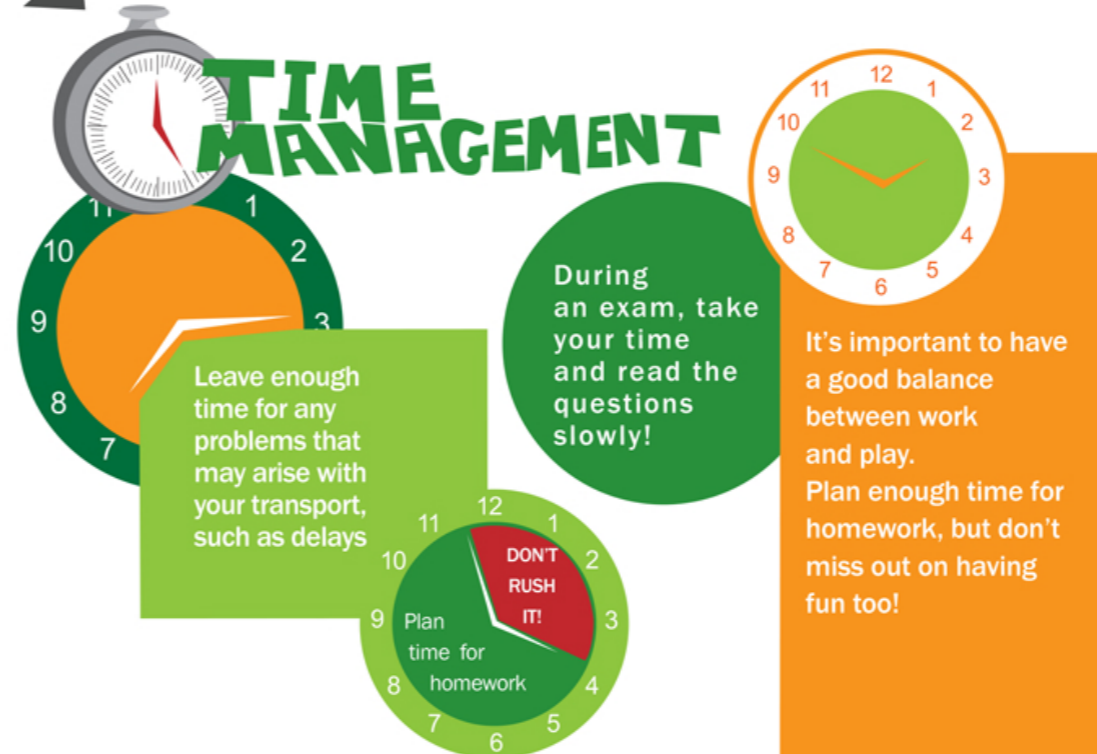
New subjects may be difficult at the beginning - be patient!
